The National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) presented Deputy Zachary Keirsey, with a certificate of recognition for his commitment to NASRO, Wilsonville's school community, and the young people he serves, thus achieving the status of National School Resource Officer Practitioner. As such, Keirsey will serve as a resource to school resource officers nationwide.

The National SRO Practitioner program was established as a way to recognize officers who have excelled in the area of school-based policing. To obtain the status of National SRO Practitioner, officers must meet certain requirements. These include the attainment of Basic, Advanced, and Supervisory NASRO certifications; a minimum of 160-hours of school safety-related police training, and attending at least one NASRO School Safety Conference.

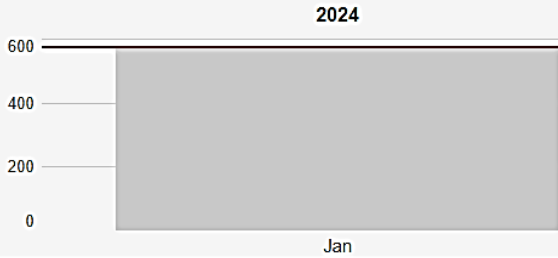

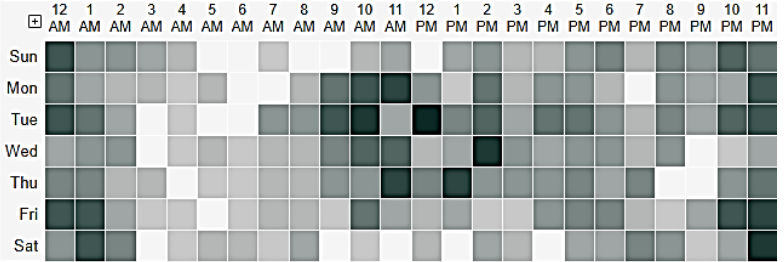
