School Resource Officer (SRO), Deputy Zach Keirse, was recognized by the National Association of School Resources Officers (NASRO) on June 9 as the recipient of the Exceptional Service Award for Region 9—which included Oregon.

Sgt. Swanson, his immediate supervisor, had this to say, "But first and foremost, Deputy Keirse is the 'neighborhood cop' at Wilsonville High School, where he maintains an office. His patrol car is adorned with the school's mascot and he is a regular at after-school sporting events...Deputy Keirse embodies everything a community needs and desires in an SRO. 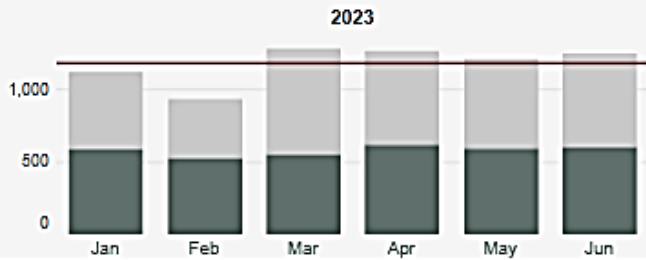

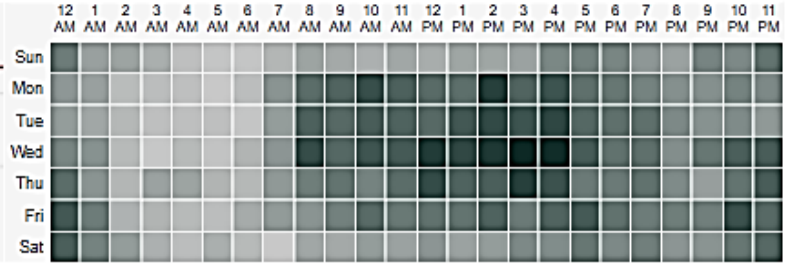
