ORDINANCE NO. 255

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PARKING REGULATIONS ON THE RIGHTS-OF-WAY OF CASTING STREET; APPROVING THE INSTALLATION OF "NO PARKING, ANYTIME" SIGNS ON SAID PUBLIC STREET SECTION; AND APPROVING THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDING FOR INSTALLATION OF THE SIGNS AS HEREIN DIRECTED

WHEREAS, the Traffic Safety Commission, at its regularly scheduled meeting held January 30, 1984, in the Council Chambers, 30000 SW Town Center Loop East, at 7:30 p.m., did review a memorandum titled TS-4-83-7 Truck Access Problems - Casting Street, from Larry R. Blanchard, Public Works Director, attached hereto and referenced herein as Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Safety Commission heard public testimony from Gene Lind, representative from Pacific Power & Light Co., Western Distribution Center, Wilsonville, to the fact that parking of vehicles on Casting Street adjacent to their south business entrance (see Exhibit 2) blocked truck traffic ingress and egress to the property; and

WHEREAS, Casting Street, being a Class "C" street, residential collector, thirty-two feet wide, but being utilized as an industrial collector for which design standards indicate forty foot width is too narrow to allow

truck traffic combined with parking on both the east and west sides of Casting Street; and

WHEREAS, parking by employees of Payless, primarily long haul truckers parking on the east side of Casting Street adjacent to the south ingress and egress to the Pacific Power & Light Western Distribution Center, have restricted the ingress and egress to Pacific Power & Light Western Distribution Center; and

WHEREAS, the manual on Uniform Traffic Safety Control Devices, Section 3B-16, page 3B-23, indicates that a minimum of twenty feet on each side of the top of the taper of the curb be designated no parking to allow ingress and egress to property, business or resident where curbing exists; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the cost to install the parking regulatory signs and painting of curbs is estimated to be one hundred dollars (\$100) for materials and fifty dollars (\$50) for labor, of which funds for materials will be allocated from Account Number 07-60710.

THE CITY OF WILSONVILLE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

 Two (2) "No Parking Anytime" signs shall be installed on Casting Street as stipulated by the Uniform Manual on Traffic Safety Devices to prohibit parking on the east side of Casting Street adjacent to the south ingressegress to Pacific Power & Light Western

Distribution Center, fifty feet (50') north and
south of the center of said ingress and egress
extended. The curb in the area shall be painted
yellow. (See Exhibit 2)

- 2. The curbs twenty (20) feet north and south of the south ingress and egress to Pacific Power & Light Western Distribution Center, shall be painted yellow to designate no parking, and signed "No Parking Anytime". (See Exhibit 2)
- 3. Funds for the installation of said parking signs and painting shall be allocated from Account No. 07-60710.

Submitted to the Council and read the first time at a regular meeting thereof on the 19th day of March, 1984, and scheduled for second reading at a regular meeting of the Council on the 2nd day of April, 1984, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p.m., at the Wilsonville City Hall.

TS-4-83-7 - TRUCK ACCESS PROBLEM CASTING STREET

PROBLEM: When Pacific Power & Light moved into the old Foseco Building they had renovated, no one realized the impact the additional truck traffic would have on ingress-egress to the property. Employees from Payless and other businesses generally park their vehicles adjacent to Pacific Power & Light Company on both the east and west sides of Casting Street.

Casting Street is a 32 foot street section. With cars parked to close to the driveway to Pacific Power and Light and directly across the street virtually is blocking truck traffic in and out.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Utilizing the Uniform Manual on Traffic Safety Control Devices, (UMTSCD) parking of vehicles should not be allowed within 25 feet each side of driveway.
- 2. By posting NO PARKING on the east side of Casting for 100 feet each side of the driveway would allow truck traffic in and out of Pacific Power & Light property.

TS-2-83-8 - NO TRACTOR-TRAILER PARKING REQUEST - SW PARKWAY-ASH MEADOWS

PROBLEM: Ordinance No. 233 titles "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PARKING REGULATIONS ON THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF PARKWAY AVENUE ON BOTH THE EAST AND WEST PORTIONS OF TOWN CENTER LOOP WEST TO BOECKMAN ROAD", established no truck parking regulations as described therein. Signs were not posted to Boeckman Road because the City ran out of signs. These signs will be installed as soon as they are available.

TS-3-83-9 - NO TRACTOR-TRAILER PARKING REQUEST COURTSIDE EASTATE SUBDIVISION PROBLEM: Tractor-Trailer vehicles are parking in the subdivision restricting traffic flow through the subdivision potentially blocking emergency vehicle access to the area.

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. According to the UMTSCD at all driveways for 25 feet each side of the driveway no parking is to be inforced.
- 2. To accommodate truck parking for those home owners who own trucks, it would be possible to restrict truck parking at those areas which are 25 feet each side of a driveway.
- 3. Truck parking becomes increasingly unacceptable when trucks park on both sides of the street. Truck parking should be restricted to one side of the street. Preferably the restriction should be placed on the north and east sides of each street in Courtside.
- 4. It may be possible to enforce a load restriction on residential streets.
