

RESOLUTION NO. 396

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING BONNEVILLE POWER ADMINISTRATION PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE AVERAGE SYSTEM COST METHODOLOGY.


WHEREAS, the Wilsonville City Council opposed the complete revision of the methodology system proposed by the Bonneville Power Administrator which would increase the rates of power to the citizens of Wilsonville, up to thirty-eight percent (38%) and would deny the citizens full benefits of the power exchange provisions under the Northwest Electric Power Planning and Conservation Act of 1980; and

WHEREAS, the extent of these benefits for the citizens of Wilsonville has been determined by a methodology developed by the Utility Regulatory Commission and approved by the Bonneville Power Administration on August 26, 1981; and


WHEREAS, the Bonneville Power Administration has not provided sound justification for proposing rate changes in the current power exchange methodology nor has he accepted reasonable requests for impartial hearings on the Bonneville Power Administration directed revision.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wilsonville City Council is opposed to the arbitrary and biased revision to the current residential and rural power exchange methodology proposed by the Bonneville Power Administrator, and the Wilsonville City Council calls upon the Bonneville Power Administrator to either withdraw this unfair proposal or at least permit adequate time and circumstances for full and independent public hearings on this change before the occurrence of this provision in July, 1984.

ADOPTED by the City Council of the City of Wilsonville at a regular meeting thereof this 21st day of May, 1984, and filed with the Wilsonville City Recorder this same day.
