FUNDS FROM GENERAL FUND

The Road fund will need to acquire a short-term loan in order to cover the FY 86-87 obligations that must be paid. This shortfall is primarily due to the gas tax levy in Washington and Clackamas counties being pulled.

The Street Light fund will also be requiring a loan to repay the existing loan from General Fund of \$25,000, authorized last fiscal year, and to cover an additional \$12,000 for the FY 86-87 shortfall.

It had previously been anticipated that the Street Light fund would be self-supporting at this time. However, due to personnel costs and the large original deficit, the fund is only slowly recovering. Continued efforts have been made in the FY 87-88 budget to reduce these costs. In addition, billing rates will be reviewed, early in the new year, to determine if they are inline.

RECOMMENDATION:

- Approve a short-term loan in the amount of \$10,000 from the City's General Fund to the Road Fund. Interest is to be paid at the concurrent rate earned at the Local Government Pool.
- Approve a short-term loan in the amount of \$37,000 from the City's General Fund to the Street Light fund. Interest is to be paid at the concurrent rate earned at the Local Government Pool.
